This new wine producing member means that IWCA membership now spreads across 12 countries worldwide.

IWCA is a collective of 48 wine producing companies across the world. They form a unified voice for change, promoting reduction in carbon emissions and setting the standard for decarbonisation

internationally. The organisation's certification is recognised globally with retailers and industry professionals and authenticates winery action to promote emission reduction.

Kir-Yianni's membership of IWCA consolidates their efforts towards sustainable practices and carbon emission reduction in the wine sector worldwide. For example, IWCA wineries annually collectively produce 34 million kWh of onsite renewable energy avoiding CO2 emissions equivalent to 10.3 million liters of gasoline consumer.

"<u>Kir-Yianni</u> was founded in 1997 by Yiannis Boutaris, one of the leading figures in the Greek wine industry, after his decision to step down from the historic family business dated back to 1879 and to start his own venture. Since 2004, Stellios Boutaris, Yiannis' son and 5th generation winemaker, leads Kir-Yianni by dynamically exploiting the precious legacy: desire for innovation, respect for tradition and true knowledge of the wine, from the grape to the end consumer. Kir-Yianni owns two Estates (vineyards and wineries) in Naoussa and Amyndeon, the grand terroirs of Northern Greece.

IWCA's objective is for all members to become Net Zero by 2050 across Scopes 1-3, ensuring consistent reductions to meet intermediate targets by 2030.
